

President's Message

We've had an exhilarating few months, culminating in the triumphant Pipe Organ Concert, "Echoes of Angels," on October 27 at Our Lady of Assumption Church in Windsor. This followed the unexpected non-concert on September 29. A heartfelt thank you to everyone who made it possible: from those who savored the spaghetti dinner, to the talented organists, to the dedicated individuals who meticulously prepared and repaired the instrument for its finest performance. Let's not forget the unsung heroes who crafted scripts, designed announcements and posters, and set up the captivating visual projections.

While the primary goal of the concert was to spotlight the ongoing pipe organ restoration at Assumption, it also achieved a wonderful secondary outcome. It united our RCCO community in presenting a diverse and captivating program of organ pieces, ensuring that every musical taste was delighted.

Last month, many of you took part in a survey aimed at shedding light on the current working conditions for church musicians in Windsor Essex.

Attached, you'll find a summary of the insights gathered from the survey. I encourage you to pay special attention to the final paragraph of the summary:

"This survey was conducted under the direction of the Executive Committee of the Windsor Essex RCCO Centre to inform its members of standards and practices across the region. Members are invited to use this information at their discretion. While the survey may not have been scientifically designed, it has served the purpose of informing and sharing within the RCCO community. Where appropriate, church musicians may communicate this information and initiate conversations with church personnel about roles, accountability and performance reviews/salary adjustments. This dialogue is essential for recognizing the valuable contributions of church musicians and ensuring they receive fair and equitable remuneration for their dedication and service."

This information is for your benefit. The Executive Committee is eager to hear your feedback and create a space where our members can share experiences and ideas. With that in mind, we're proposing an online 'Chat Time.' We'll get back to you soon with a suggested date and time.

The Organist/Clergy dinner was well attended on November 22nd. The aim of the event was to help create a meaningful working relationship between clergy and their respective church musicians. The Rev. Canon Ann Smith was the moderator. She is uniquely suited to this role because in addition to being a clergy, she has many years of experience as a church organist.

Preparing for this discussion, a number of us have read the book "Rivals or a Team? Clergy-Musician Relationships in the Twenty-First Century" by Eileen Guenther. The book explores the dynamics between clergy and musicians within the Christian church. It emphasizes the importance of collaboration and teamwork to enhance the ministry's effectiveness with em-

Land acknowledgement

We of the Windsor-Essex RCCO Centre acknowledge that we are on land and surrounded by water, originally inhabited by Indigenous Peoples who have travelled this area since time immemorial.
